

THIRD 'CAREER NIGHT' WELCOMED BACK 23 ALUMNI AND FRIENDS

Consistent with the ER School District's Mission ('to prepare all students to be post-secondary ready') and a goal of the ER Alumni Foundation ('to help build a stronger school system, a stronger community, and a stronger future for all East Rochester students'), the ERAF sponsored its third Career Fair in cooperation with the Junior/Senior High School the evening of Thursday, March 15. The purpose of the Career Fairs is to provide our 7-12 students with information they can use as they begin facing important career and advanced-education decisions.

The event featured 23 alumni and friends participating in these nine categories: arts and communication (Wendy Paige Doll, Casey Filiaci, and Gene Filiaci), business (Jim Baglieri and Tim Henry), food service (John Fee, Rene Capponi Madera, and Don Verni), medical and health services (Dr. Neil Herendeen, Mary Kay Ross Parrone, and Todd Spring), public and social services (Fred Ricci), science and engineering (Chris Lopez, Tom Quinzi, and Sergio Rucci), skilled trades (Ted Conners, Dan Parshall, and Peter Quinzi), teaching (Kristina Barbero, Angela Beltran Fuller, and Anita Mance), and athletics (Dave Jenkins and Ron Whitcomb). Student participants had the opportunity to hear interesting and informative comments from all our speakers, and ask questions of them. They were also eligible to win several education-related door prizes. The evening concluded with refreshments provided by the Culinary Arts program, under the direction of Mr. Fee.

Although student and parent turnout was lower than last year's event, feedback during and directly after was extremely positive. It's our hope we were able to touch some of these kids and help them with education and career planning. The ERAF is proud to participate in this endeavor, and will look to incorporate feedback from our students, speakers, and administration for our next one. 2012 Sam Urzetta Alumni Classic set for Friday, Aug. 3

The Alumni Foundation will be hosting its sixth annual golf tournament this summer. The Sam Urzetta Alumni Classic is planned for Friday, Aug. 3 at Lima Country Club. Originally known as the East Rochester Open, our tournament was renamed the Sam Urzetta Alumni Classic in 2008. Our intent was to honor our dear friend and a true golfing legend. In addition to his many sporting, social, and charitable contributions, Sam was a founding member of the ERAF Board of Directors and a key member of the ER Open committee.

The tournament will be a 'scramble' format to encourage participation by golfers of all skill levels, and will be played on both the Charleston Pines and Island Oaks courses. Registration, a continental breakfast, and a putting contest will begin at 7 am, and the tourney will kick off with a shotgun start at 9 am.

The 'Classic' is our major annual fundraiser. Over the past five years, the tournament has raised over \$58,000. Proceeds have been used to fund education-related grants and projects the foundation has undertaken on behalf of ER students. The financial success of this event is attributable to alumni and business sponsors who have generously donated cash and other gifts totaling over \$74,000, and to the 846 golfers who have joined us at previous tournaments (including the record 212 who played last summer).

While our primary goal is to raise money in support of ERAF grants and projects, we also place heavy emphasis on the renewal of old acquaintances and having fun. To this end, we use both courses to prevent playing delays, keep our entry fees as low as possible to promote participation, and use the 'scramble' format to make the event fun for all levels of golfers.

The entry fee of \$85 per person includes a continental breakfast, welcome gifts, greens fee and cart, tee prize(s), a hot dog and soft drink at the turn, a luncheon buffet, loads of door prizes, and a charitable donation to ERAF. Also, a putting contest, Mulligan purchase, skins games, and a giant raffle will be available that day for nominal fees.

To avoid course and banquet delays, a maximum of 55 foursomes (220 players) will be registered. We will attempt to accommodate foursome preferences with regard to course selection, but early registrants will be given priority. In addition, foursomes who have registered and paid by Saturday, June 30 will be entered in an 'early bird' drawing, and the winning foursome will receive a full refund of their \$340 registration fee.

Registration forms are available in the Superintendent's Office at the school, and on the ERAF Website – *www.erschools.org/alumni.cfm*. Registering early is a good idea, as we expect to reach our player limit in early July.
