	A. APPROVAL OF THE 2018 - 2019 Tax Levy Limit of 2.14% Background Information: Districts are required by law to submit a calculated tax levy limit figure to the Office of the New York State Comptroller by March 1st each year. The tax levy limit is the maximum percentage a district can increase its tax levy without a 60% approval by the voters. The District has submitted a tax levy limit of 2.14%. This percentage limits the tax levy to a maximum of \$14,016,778. The law is unclear whether a district must approve this figure by resolution. However, it is recommended that the Board of Education approve it. The ta levy limit may be changed as new data is provided. Approval of the tax levy limit does not



obligate the District to implement it. It merely publicly establishes the threshold at which a district may set its tax levy. If a District decided to exceed this threshold, the votes must approve it by a 60% majority.

### **Recommendation:**

A motion for approval is recommended for the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the East Rochester board of Education approve the 2018 - 2019 tax levy limit of 2.14%.

### B. ADOPTION OF THE 2018 - 2019 BUDGET

### **Background Information:**

The Board of Education needs to adopt the Superintendent's recommended budget for the 2018 - 2019 school year.

### **Recommendation:**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education had reviewed the 2018 - 2019 budget recommended by the Superintendent of Schools, and

WHEREAS, the Board considered program updates, student needs and update safety and security needs as aligned with district goals and NYS Board of Regents' Reform Agenda expectations,

WHEREAS, the Board believes the budget to be presented to the public maintains and improves the instructional program and operation of the school system, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education present to the District voters a General Fund Budget in the total amount of \$28,232,922.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education approve the Property Tax Report Card for the 2018 - 2019 proposed budget.

### C. <u>VOTE ON MONROE #1 BOCES ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET</u>

### **Background Information:**

Component districts are required to vote on their BOCES administrative budget.

Recommendation:

A motion for approval is recommended for the following resolution:

**RESOLVED,** that the Board of Education of the East Rochester Union Free School District votes to approve the proposed Monroe #1 BOCES Administrative Budget, in the amount of \$5,647,175 for the 2018 - 2019 fiscal year.

### D. VOTE ON MONROE #1 BOCES BOARD CANDIDATES

### **Background Information:**

### Seat #1

**RESOLVED**, to cast one vote for the election of Robert Dickson, resident of the West Irondequoit Central School District, as a member of the Monroe #1 BOCES Board for a term of office which will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2021.

### **Seat #2**

**RESOLVED**, to cast one vote for the election of Thomas Nespeca, resident of the Webster Central School District, as a member of the Monroe #1 BOCES Board for a term of office which will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2021.

### Seat #3

**RESOLVED**, to cast one vote for the election of Maureen Nupp, resident of the Fairport Central School District, as a member of the Monroe #1 BOCES Board for a term of office which will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2021.

### **Seat #4**

**RESOLVED**, to cast one vote for the election of Sora Sachs, resident of the Brighton Central School District, as a member of the Monroe #1 BOCES Board for a term of office which will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2021.

#### Seat #5

**RESOLVED**, to cast one vote for the election of Nancy Semal, resident of the East Irondequoit Central School District, as a member of the Monroe #1 BOCES Board for a term of office which will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2021.

### E. APPROVAL LITTLE LIBRARY DONATION

### **Background Information:**

The Builders Club (Kiwanis) built a "Little Library" and donated it to the the elementary school. "Little Libraries" are structures that can be mounted on a building or post where students, families, and community members can take a book and leave a book, if they want. The "Little Library" is monitored on a regular basis and books are replenished as needed. Gently used books are used to keep the "Little Library" stocked. We are considering mounting this donation near the Elementary School playground. It is recommended that the Board of Education accept such donations.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the donation of a "Little Library" from the Builders Club (Kiwanis).
